Introduction

"Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses." 1 Timothy 6:12

Don't think twice, you are in a battle, for your child's soul. The battlefield is planet earth, you are the Generals in-charge. For the battle to be fought successfully, there must be clear lines of separation, a **Stone Wall**. The combat zone for most skirmishes will take place in the mind, so the mind must be guarded by the helmet of Salvation¹. Always keeping in mind that "we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places."² A battle arises when enemy soldiers enter God's territory for the purpose of fighting for victory, **your child's soul**. The battle plan must be clearly presented, understood by all, and acted upon in unity.

Many Christians have given up any outward sign of identity with Jesus Christ, having no clear standards of separation, a **Stone Wall**, and enter the world, to find pleasure, entertainment, and friendship. **God's Word**, is not being clearly presented in many families and churches, and the plan for victory is unclear. Few see the victory to be had in "fighting the good fight of faith,"³ living a pure, separated and holy life; active in Bible study, prayer, worshipping God, and soul-winning.

"Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses." 1 Timothy 6:12

Biblical separation, a **Stone Wall**, is clearly taught in God's Word, and cannot be different in practice any more than the plan of Salvation. Children that are not taught to have a **Stone Wall** will have difficulty seeing the battle and that the battle can be won. This child will more likely see that their purpose in life is to be one of fighting for the desires of their flesh and esteeming themselves. (read Nehemiah)

"Surely your turning of things upside down shall be esteemed as the potter's clay: for shall the work say of him that made it, He made me not? or shall the thing framed say of him that framed it, He had no understanding?" Isaiah 29:16
(Also read *Self-Esteem, Satan's Most Harmful*⁴)

Children must learn to clearly sense the presence of the **Stone Wall**, a clearly defined set of beliefs that teach the child not to esteem themselves. Lucifer esteemed himself above God and we see the outcome of that. This Biblical **Stone Wall** must provide clear-cut answers so our children can resist their own fleshly desires, fight temptation, and remain separate from the world. This **Stone Wall** must become a standard, a typical part of the life in the family.

"Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." James 4:4

For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. 1 John 2:16

This **Stone Wall** from the world, is built through teaching, training, and setting an example. This **Stone Wall** should provide answers for the following questions:

1. Where can I go?
2. What should I think about?
3. How should I dress?
4. How should I speak?
5. What interests should I have?
6. How should any of these interests be limited?
7. How should I choose my friends?
8. What can I listen to?
9. What can I watch on TV?
10. What should I look at?
11. What should I read?
12. What should my attitude be?
13. What is my purpose in life?
14. What is my purpose in working, talking, playing, eating, all things?
15. What are the basic truths of my faith?

Being able to answer these questions and others with Biblical reason will help your child to resist peer pressure, to choose Godly friends, to choose forms of entertainment, and to "keep under their body, and bring it into subjection."⁵

"But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway." 1 Corinthians 9:27

A definite, uncompromising, unmovable **Stone Wall** is necessary in every person's life. For children, this wall is provided by the parents until the child has firmly established an internal **Stone Wall** which guides their life. The basis for this **Stone Wall** is God's Word. It stands as an unmovable standard through which a Christian receives protection. (See *Behavior Training Using God's Word*⁶ as an addition training tool.)

All Christians need:

1. Protection from themselves. - Living a life in the flesh.

"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." Romans 12:1-2

"Howbeit we speak wisdom among them that are perfect: yet not the wisdom of this world, nor of the princes of this world, that come to nought: But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory:" 1 Corinthians 2:6-7

2. Protection from Satan. - A Godly **Stone Wall** helps protect us from Satan, who is a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour. A physical wall would protect us from a lion in a zoo and so will a Godly **Stone Wall** protect us from Satan. But, keep in mind that Satan comes as an angel of light but will be a wolf in sheep's clothing.

"Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:" 1 Peter 5:8

"And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works." 1 Corinthians 11:14-15

"Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them." Matthew 7:15-20

3. Protection from this world. - Pressures of living in this world, can easily influence those who do not have a **Stone Wall** of separation.

"For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come." 1 Timothy 4:8 (see also 1 Timothy 6:6 & 1 Timothy 6:11)

"For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be. So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God." Romans 8:6-8

"Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God? Whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." James 4:4

A great verse to have your child memorize that will give the reassurance of God's promises of protection is Psalms 91.

Instruction

Parents, not the church or Christian school, have the primary responsibility to teach God's Word to their children.

Training

Training is the consistent, diligent application of God's Word to a child's desires, thoughts, speech, attitudes, and behaviors. Training involves correction, discipline and a repetition of what has been taught from God's Word. (See also Behavior Training Using God's Word) ¹

"Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6

"Wherefore I will not be negligent to put you always in remembrance of these things, though ye know them, and be established in the present truth." 2 Peter 1:12

"The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame. Correct thy son, and he shall give thee rest; yea, he shall give delight unto thy soul. " Proverbs 29:15,17

A parent who is diligent to be a daily example of all that is taught from God's Word will have a greater influence on their child.

"Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ. " 1 Corinthians 11:1

Keep in mind that clear uncompromising standards, a **Stone Wall**, should be established at home. Bending to excuses like ("There are only two bad words in this movie." "Everybody else at church watches it." "It's just a game." "Things are different today - we can't be so strict.") ends the wall of separation, that **Stone Wall** now crumbles. If this is the case in your home start now to rebuild that **Stone Wall**, one stone at a time. When we bend to excuses this gives the child an unclear sense of right and wrong; along with a lack of discernment in situations where direct commands may not apply. Bending to excuses can also establish the world view of situation ethics.

Lesson 1
